

Annual Report 2023-2024

Management of Westgate Park

The City of Melbourne will take up management of Westgate Park on 1 January 2026 and the preparation for the transfer has begun with talks in April and a workshop involving the committee and volunteers.

I acknowledge the efforts made by former Lord Mayor Sally Capp in driving this move. She was a good advocate for the change, strongly encouraged by another former Lord Mayor, our Lecki Ord, who has for many years been a member, a wise counsel, an excellent planner, organiser and committee member for Westgate Biodiversity. We miss her.

The City of Port Philip require us to vacate the Williamstown Road nursery site also on 1 January 2026 so we face some critical deadlines and uncertainty about how the new compound/nursery will be funded.

We met with Andrew Kelly at Parks Vic quarterly, with updates on issues such as the state of toilets and an ongoing plea for more regular mowing to stem the spread of weeds. Weeds have now invaded many areas of the Park, particularly sections most recently planted, however our work crews are making big inroads, clearing areas.

A word about George Fotheringham

For more than 20 years George led the work to turn a shamefully neglected Westgate Park into one with the greatest biodiversity riches imaginable in the middle of Melbourne. His plant knowledge and his drive to bring back nature was endless. We don't see much of George in the Park these days and I know that if he could, he would be there.

Bili Nursery

Rhod Cunningham, our manager, has transformed Bili Nursery, expanding the range of seed collected and species propagated, the customer reach and the drive for improving successful plant development. For instance, trials of Alyxia buxifolia increased production by 40% and Correa reflexa and Correa alba by 30%.



There is a growing demand for indigenous plant species as councils and landscapers recognise the importance of biodiversity. We were approached to 'revitalise' Gasworks Park with indigenous plants. Our retail trade has more than doubled this year thanks to a concerted effort by Amy Denyer on Insta and Maggie in a rejuvenated 'shop'.

We are using a section of the Wharf Road Triangle to grow plants on, however, operating from 2 sites and lack of nursery space severely limits our capacity to supply.

While Westgate Park is still an important source of seed, the Bili Nursery team now has permission to collect ~100 species from sites well beyond the Melbourne region such as the Brisbane Ranges, Anglesea, Bacchus Marsh, the Macedon Ranges. This means our seed room is



well stocked but, as always, we rely on working bees and volunteers to help us with seed cleaning. Grey Cat deserves a mention as Chief Mouser, without whom our baby plants would be at great risk.

This year new connections were made and tours taken to Angair, the Cranbourne Botanical Gardens, the Euroa Arboretum, and the Goulburn Catchment seed collection and the Brisbane Ranges groups. Closer to home, we planted the Victoria Harbor Urban Forest – a space surrounded by tall buildings, opened by the then Lord Mayor Sally Capp. We hosted Gardens for Wildlife workshops for the City of Port Phillip and Birding Australia collaborated with us for an online gardening course with Mars Reid and Emma Cutting.

We now have an extensive data base of the landscape industry and our enewsletters are generating business but we have had to knock back big orders because of space restraints.

In November we agreed to hold a spring sale/festival in Westgate Park (very successfully held in October 2024 on as part of Riverfest).

Citizen science at Bili Landcare

The Hollows for Habitat project resumed at Westgate Park in earnest at the beginning of the year. A core team enthusiastic people are monitoring the boxes and recording the microbat echolocation calls around the Park. So far, we have found just one microbat in our boxes but recorded calls on all our nocturnal walks – all from the Gould's Wattled Bat.

Of course bird surveys are still being held monthly thanks to Rob Youl and his team of Peter Parrington, Rob Youl, Lyn Griffen, John McRae, Elke Link and Andrew McCutcheon with a special mention for our bird and other creatures photographer, Ursula Dutkiewicz.

Security

At Westgate Park thieves stole copper from the former Herald & Weekly Times building next door and discovered some of our valuable equipment - a trailer, chainsaws, brushcutters etc - were taken. The community rallied raising \$5k for a new trailer and \$3.4k for wheel locks and security systems. Go fund me raised \$2.5k.

Snippets from the Park

We were excited to see the Grey Mistletoe flower for the first time and the Drooping Mistletoe growing. Water levels remain fairly high so our aquatic plants are doing well as are our saltmarsh plants and our remnant vegetation.







Engagement with local schools

We worked with Port Melbourne Secondary College on their Evolve program and Albert Park Secondary College students came to the Park for a week of biodiversity activities early in the year. Melbourne Grammar Year 9s helped us out with weeding in 1st heath.
